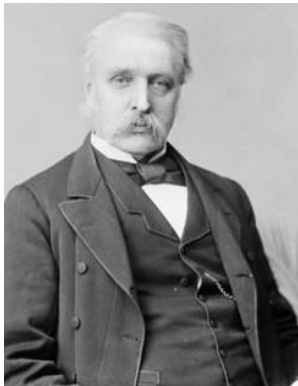


LANARK MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT FROM CONFEDERATION

Over 150 years from confederation in 1867, Perth has found itself as part of seven different ridings (constituencies) -- Lanark North, Lanark South, Lanark, Lanark-Renfrew, Lanark-Carleton, Lanark-Frontenac-Lennox & Addington, and Lanark-Frontenac-Kingston and has been represented in the Parliament of Canada by 22 members.

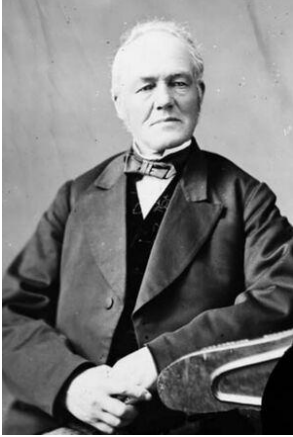
LANARK NORTH



William McDougall (1822-1905) – Lanark North, 1867-1872, Liberal-Conservative, Later represented constituency of Halton, Minister of Public Works 1867-1869.



Alexander Morris (1826-1889) – Lanark North, 1867-1872, Liberal-Conservative, Minister of Inland Revenue 1869-1872.



Daniel Galbraith (1813-1879)– Lanark North, 1872-1879, Liberal.



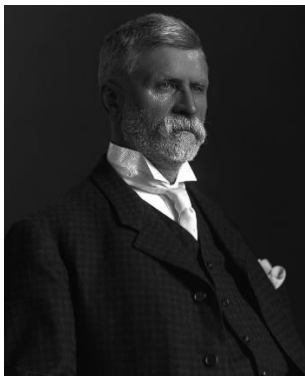

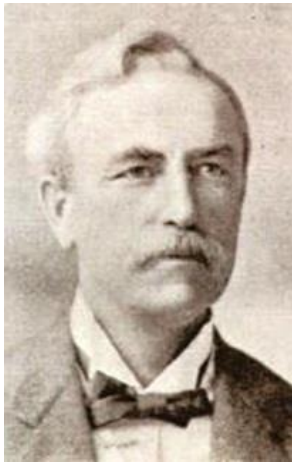
Donald Greenfield Macdonell (1849-1916) – Lanark North, 1880-1882, Liberal.

Liberal.

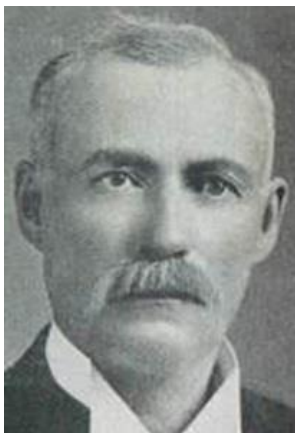


William Thoburn (1847-1928) – Lanark North, 1908-1917, Conservative.

LANARK SOUTH

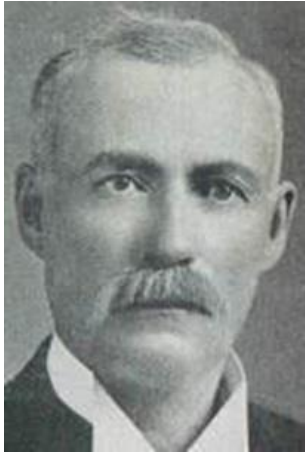

Paul Wyatt Dick (1940-2018) – Lanark-Renfrew-Carleton, 1972-1988 - Deputy Opposition House Leader 1983, Associate Minister of Defence 1986-1988, Minister of Supply and Services 1988-1993, Minister of Public Works 1993. Progressive Conservative.
